Location: Hayling Island, Hants.

Meet at the small car park at 10:00hrs. SU/197996029.

Take the A3023 off the A27 to Hayling Island over the bridge, ignore the first car park and after the Esso Garage turn right 50 m on to Beach car park. Birding the Oyster Beds and Langstone Harbour in the morning.

Then relocating to the eastern end of the island birding around Black Point. Parking in Seafarers Walk PO119TA near the entrance to the Public Footpath. Lunch required and winter footwear. Distance 4 miles.

Suggested clothing: Warm, waterproof clothing depending on weather conditions; strong footwear. In summer, sun hat, sunscreen and appropriate clothing for sunny weather.

Fluids: Please bring sufficient fluids appropriate to the weather conditions.

First Aid kits	All	Low	SOS walk leaders are required to carry a basic small first aid kit, which SOS will supply. This does not imply that the leader has qualifications to use this content, but will act in a common sense way should a situation arise. A central register of who was sent these kits will be maintained for ongoing replacement.
