Location: Starting from Downslink car park in West End Lane just west of The Old Railway pub this walk will be along the Downslink bridleway and public footpaths through fields.

Brief description: The route on the day will be determined according to where birds have recently been seen and how flooded the fields are. Winter floods can hold good numbers of wildfowl and gulls, with Teal, Wigeon, Gadwall and Pintail usually present. If the walk is done in the spring, there should be birdsong in the bushes and trees lining the old railway line, skylarks singing over the fields, and hopefully Grey Herons nesting nearby.

Suggested clothing: In winter – waterproof clothing and winter boots and/or wellingtons.

In summer good footwear is recommended.
